



Nabunturan at a Glance...

History. NABUNTURAN was once a barangay of the municipality of Compostela. The name is a derivative from the word "**BUNGTOD**". The natives called it such due to its elevated terrain compared to other areas within the valley. The early settlement was governed by a headman called "BAGANI" but was under the supervision of the Municipal District President of Compostela over matters only concerning civil affairs. For the maintenance of peace and order, the area was under the immediate supervision of the Philippine Constabulary Detachment of Camp Kalaw in Moncayo, now a municipality. From barangay Jaguimitan in the north to barangay Mawab, now a



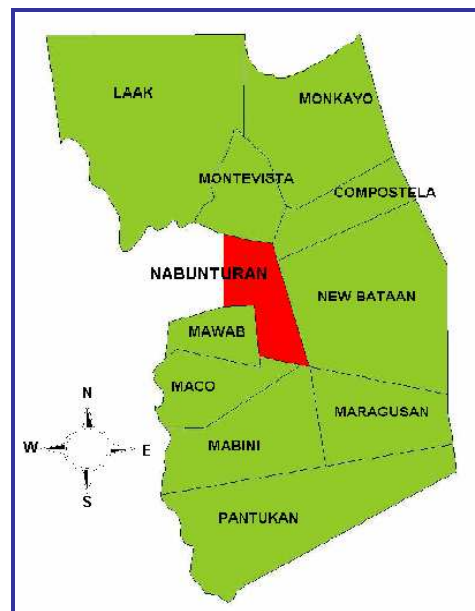

municipality in the south, the whole Compostela town was divided into two (2) municipal districts, the district of Moncayo and the other was the district of Compostela with the latter's seat of local government in barangay Nabunturan, now the municipality of Nabunturan.

After the World War II in 1945 when the American forces landed in Davao City, the Philippine Civil Assistance Unit (PCAU) established the civil government of Compostela right at Nabunturan because of its accessibility to and from Davao City. During the liberation, major roads and highways were later improved and it had lured more settlers. As years marched on, Nabunturan became the center of commerce and eventually the conduit of government services. Thus, the need of converting it into a separate municipality was felt. This need was then considered by top-policy makers as urgent. On **July 23, 1957**, through **Republic Act No. 2038**, Nabunturan was created as a new political unit, separate and distinct from the mother municipality of Compostela.

On January 30, 1998, the President of the Philippines, Fidel V. Ramos signed into law the creation of the 79th Province in the country, the COMPOSTELA VALLEY pursuant to Republic Act No. 8470, which further created the Municipality of Nabunturan as its capital town. ¹

Geography. The municipality of **NABUNTURAN** is situated along the northeastern part of the province of Davao, falling within 125^o - 27' east longitude and 7^o - 41' north latitude. Nabunturan is 88 kilometers away from Davao City and 33 kilometers from the newly created Tagum City, via concrete/asphalted National Highway. It is bounded in the north by the municipality of Monte Vista, on the west by New Corella, on southwest by Mawab, on the south by Maco and Mabini, on the southeast by Maragusan, on the east by New Bataan and by Compostela on the northeast. It has a total land area of approximately 24,120 hectares or roughly 241.2 square kilometers comprising twenty eight (28) barangays and 40 sitios all interlinked by roads and bridges.

Demography. Nabunturan registered a total population of 67,365 in 2007. The municipality's population density stood at 279 per square kilometer. Among the 28 barangays in the municipality, barangay Poblacion or the town proper area posted the highest population density with 2,338 persons per square kilometer. Majority or about 60.9 percent of the populace in the municipality speaks Cebuano because most of the early settlers were Visayan-speaking migrants.

Governance.² Nabunturan is considered as a first class municipality. The total income of the municipality significantly increased by 20.8 percent, from 86.96 million pesos in 2007 to 105.06 million pesos in 2008. The Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) of the municipality was 72.63 million pesos in 2008. This translates to an IRA per capita of 1,078 pesos.

Economic Sector

Agriculture

Crops. Due to its arable land and generally good climate, agriculture is the primary economic activity in the municipality of Nabunturan. Majority or about 68.5 percent of the total land area of the municipality is predominantly occupied by agricultural lands utilized in various crops like coconut, banana, rice, corn, fruit crops, etc. The largest portion of agricultural land is planted with coconut (44.9%), banana (12.7%), and rice (12.5%). To support its farmers, the municipality of Nabunturan has invested several agricultural support facilities such as Small Water Impounding Projects (SWIPs) and Communal Irrigation Systems.

Livestock and Poultry. The municipality of Nabunturan has a total of 58.5 hectares of land devoted to animal pasture, which are located at barangays Ogao, Cabidianan, New Daus, Sta. Maria and Libasan. Most of the animals being raised in the municipality are cattle, hog/swine, goat, sheep and poultry.

Fishery. With the presence of the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources Research Outreach Station (BFAR-ROS), fingerlings and fish supplies provider in the municipality, Nabunturan has various inland fishing grounds. As of 2004, there were 19 barangays having backyard fishponds and fish cages that are producing freshwater fish in the municipality.
